Dave will share his Kayak adventures as he paddles down the Mississippi River, through the Eire Canal and into the Hudson River ending at the Statue of Liberty. Ellingson, inspired by childhood stories of Huckleberry Finn, has pursued a life of adventures, learning and discovery. He is an author and speaker on topics ranging from his personal kayaking trips, environmental care, and social justice to holistic health and spirituality.

Last year, on Zoom, we were treated to his film "Coming Home", tracing his family's Norwegian roots as he paddled through the Sogne and Hardanger fjords in Norway. Dave is known as the Paddle Pilgrim and is a frequent guest on "Travel with Rick Steves." Dave often speaks to community groups, libraires, churches, colleges, and retreat centers. Ellingson is an ordained Lutheran pastor, Master Gardener, former distance runner and triathletes and is married with five grown children. He has also formed the Dave Ellingson scholarship for Environmental Studies and Social Justice for students who need financial help and mentoring. Come meet this warm, accomplished and entertaining adventurer!

IN MEMORIUM

Sven Kalve passed away March 6, 2022, at age 84. He joined the Lodge in 1977 AND was a Golden Member. Sven was born on the island of Smeholmen on the west coast of Norway. He immigrated to the U.S. with his father and a younger brother on the SS Stavanger, after a family tragedy in 1953. They settled in Ballard and Sven graduated from Ballard High School. He became a U.S. citizen in 1958 and began to work for the Boeing Company, and met Marta. Sven received his degree from the UW in 1971. He traveled to Norway, happily renewing and enriching the relationship with the family there. In the Seattle area he served on the Board of the National Nordic Museum, Highline Community College Council, Federal Way Library Board, PDC Conservation Committee of King County, Municipal League of King County, Citizens' Election Oversight Committee and other organizations. He worked with the Boeing Company over 40 years, culminating his career as a finance executive. Sven is survived by his wife of 60 years, Marta; daughters Kari, Corinne and Gwen Kalve and grandchild Puck Franta; brother Harold. Sven would be honored by remembrances to the National Nordic Museum.

Sigurd Odegaard passed away March 15, 2022, at age 95. He joined the Lodge in 1954 and was a SON Life Member and recently received his 65-year pin in 2019. He was an active member of the Lodge and a Charter member of Leikarringen in 1960. He continued to participate in Leikarringen anniversaries through the years, the last one in 2020. Sig had many officer positions in Leikarringen from treasurer, vice president, and librarian. Else, his wife, also participated as secretary, vice president, and assistant dance director. Sig was involved with construction and put his knowledge to work while he served on the Leif Erikson Building Association from May 1987 – May 2011, where he also served as Vice President for many years. Sig contributed over 1,00 hours in helping build Leif Erikson Lodge. He was honored in 1992 as Man of the Year for his contributions to LEL. He was all things Leif Erikson and also participated as a director in the Leif Erikson Recreation Association (Norway Park Sigurd will be missed by his family and many, many friends. The memorial will go to the Leif Erikson Educational Foundation.

Trudy Stuart passed away March 13, 2022, at age 88. She joined the Lodge in 1981 and was a Golden Member. She danced with Leikerringen for many years, enjoying all kinds of dance, from a Finnish polka to a Norwegian pols. She was active until early in the 1980s when she had an injury to her knee while dancing in Minnesota at a dance camp, which put an end to one of her greatest loves. During her young years, she spent time in Scotland going to school and wearing itchy wool sweaters and eating porridge, neither of which she was fond of (and, yes, she was part of that Stuart family). Trudy survived WWII. She told stories of her father, home and how wonderful it was before the war and how things changed after the Nazis took over Austria. After the war, she met an American serviceman and immigrated to the United States. She also loved her Norwegian heritage. Her banking background also meant she was often involved with the

financial aspects for such groups as the Norwegian Seventeenth of May Committee and the Norway Center Board. Trudy will be missed by her many friends and family members. The memorial will go to the Leif Erikson Educational Foundation.

We remember **John Sjong**, who passed away; on March 2, 2022, at age 85. He was a member of the Edmonds Lodge but spent a lot of time in Seattle and was a member of the Norwegian Commercial Club and attended many events at LEL and, in fact, encouraged folks he knew in the Seattle area to join the Lodge. John was born in Horten, Norway and grew up on the mountain farm of Skotet and in Sykkylven. After serving in the Norwegian military from 1956-57, he moved to the United States, where he worked as a machinist until being drafted into the U.S. Army (1960-62). John married Berit Ingebritsen in 1967. John was proud of his Norwegian heritage. He came from humble beginnings to a life that left a lasting impact on the people he met, the industry he helped build and the cultural community he supported. He is survived by his three daughters and their families: Tina & David Hoyt; Megan, Elizabeth and Karl Jan; Lisa Sjong – Travis & Kelli; Vicky and Jim Jaguish – Allison & Katie and his beloved dog Toby.

TUBFRIM

Thank you to all the lodges that collect stamps for Tubfrim, one of Norway's Special Projects that sells used postage stamps using the proceeds to help provide financial aid to help improve the quality of life for handicapped children and youth.

Clip the stamps off of envelopes or packages received in the mail, being careful to leave a ¹/₂ inch margin to protect the stamps. When you get a pound of stamps, write your name, address, phone number, lodge and lodge number on a 3" by 5" card and place it with the stamps into a zip lock bag. Or complete the Tubfrim form available in the office. Forever Stamps are acceptable. Please don't send stamps with damaged perforation, edges, etc. They will be thrown away. The cards are sent to the International Sons of Norway Office in Minneapolis and entered into a drawing for a trip to Norway.

The stamps will be delivered to Bothell Lodge to the Tubfrim coordinators for District 2, SON who will arrange to have them shipped to Norway with no cost to the district except for boxing materials. This is a simple and easy way to contribute to one of Sons of Norway charitable projects.

SYTTENDE MAI, 1943

This speech was delivered by Norwegian Consul Christen A. Stang at the 17th of May celebration in Seattle in 1943, which was held at Norway Hall in downtown Seattle.

When I am bringing a greeting form Norway and Norwegians today, it is a greeting from a people which brutal force has divided in two- those outside and those in Norway- in occupied territory. The unhesitating and determined resistance which immediately was offered the invaders more than 3 years ago made it possible for those outside- mainly the Norwegian Merchant Marine to reorganize and continue under the Norwegian flag in the war effort. From my own experience I can tell you that the ships on Puget Sound were under way, some in a couple of days and all in less than a week after the invasion.

The Norwegian Merchant fleet at that time involved more than 1000 ships and was by a British authority estimated to be worth the fighting value of one million men. Many of those ships are no more. About 50% have been lost, but fortunately a large percentage of the crews have been saved. On the other hand we have the report that one Norwegian ship recently completed her 51st trip from the east coast to England mostly without convoy, and had delivered 350,000 tons of cargo.

Of our outside activities must also be mentioned the magnificent Norwegian Air Force, that now has returned to Germany the bombload dropped over Norway with lots of interest. We also have a very active navy, and an Army that impatiently is waiting to transfer their activities to the home soil. Last, but not least, we must think of our friends and relatives in Norway, who form what we call the home front. We know they are fighting with every means at their disposal, and I will just quote a few lines from a message they sent to King Haakon on his birthday:

message they sent to King Haakon on his birthday: "The Norwegian front has one line of action and only one. We have chosen to live or die in a fight for our native land, and there can be no thought of compromise. This line of action of our Norwegian home front is independent of any aid from our Allies, yes even of the war's outcome. Let it be said today: The Norwegian home front will never give in".

On behalf of all these Norwegians- both inside and outside Norway- I wish to say thank you- to you with Norwegian blood who are arranging this affair and to our friends that are here to honor Norway and make the affair a success. I like to leave with you this message: While the Norwegians are hopeful and can see some lights now, they are still facing the cruelest reality and deprived of everything you think a necessity. They shall, however, continue to throw in everything for common victory and freedom, and they are depending on you to do the same. **Submitted by LEL Historian, Christine Anderson**
