Lillia Spelmanslag is a group of young people from ages 8-18 who play traditional Nordic music. Martha Levenson is their director, and the group has been playing throughout the Northwest at folkdances, concerts, exhibitions and festivals such as Folklife, Midsommarfest and Julefest.

The musicians learn techniques, focus on clear sound, and work on poise, confidence and stage presence. Music is taught in the traditional way and the students learn

music by ear, including harmony and rhythm.

In 2013 Lilli Spelmanslag toured Sweden and in July of this year, they will be going to Norway. A three-week tour is planned studying the hardingfele with master teachers in Voss and they will attend a music and dance class with Norwegian kids. The musicians will travel to Roros where they will study regular fiddle and learn about the copper mines and the Sami tradition of reindeer herding. Two large concerts are planned in Voss and Roros along with several pop-up venues.

At our membership meeting, they will present tunes on the regular fiddle and the hardingfele. Come support these young musicians who will be the caretakers of

Nordić traditional music in our community!

LEIF ERIKSON LODGE TURNS 120!

120 years! At our business meeting in May we celebrate our 120th anniversary and honor our past presidents. On May 13, 1903, we held our very first business meeting. When our Lodge was formed, it was part of a new organization called the Grand Lodge of Sons of Norway of the Pacific Coast, very separate from the Sons of Norway in the Midwest. On May 13, 1903, the Sons of Norway of the Pacific Coast was organized as a fraternal organization of Norwegians and their descendants. S. S. Langland was elected Grand Lodge president. The men in attendance proceeded later that same day to form the first lodge on the local level, which was our lodge, and called it Leif Erikson Lodge No. 1. The first historic meeting took place at 818 First Avenue in the Forester's Hall. A. A. Anderson, who was born in Denmark, was elected our first president. He remained president of our Lodge until July 29, 1903, when he resigned because he believed the site of the very first picnic, Pleasant Beach, had a poor reputation and did not deserve the patronage of the Sons of Norway. S.S. Langland then filled Mr. Anderson's position.

Our weekly meeting minutes were in English until July 13, 1906, after which the minutes were taken in Norwegian. Olaf J. Toft, a former professor with the University of Oslo and a former member of Sons of Norway in Minneapolis, which was organized on January 16, 1895, was credited with much energetic work in getting both our local Lodge and the Sons of Norway of the Pacific Coast formed. Several years ago his daughter and granddaughter visited

our lodge.

A significant change in the Grand Lodge was adopted in February 1907. In a special meeting they adopted a motion to discontinue writing life insurance. Then on February 21, 1909, at the convention in Bellingham delegates were to vote for consolidation with the Supreme Lodge in the Midwest only on the condition that insurance was voluntary. A year later Sons of Norway in the Midwest announced it had been licensed to write life insurance in California and Washington, opening the way for the merger of the two organizations on July 9, 1910, at the Supreme Lodge convention in Grand Forks, North Dakota. This convention marked the creation of Districts 1 and 2 of which our Lodge is a part. Due to the noncompulsory insurance of the western group, participation in the insurance program was made voluntary for everyone.

In 1907 the State Legislature appropriated \$1,000,000 for the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition with the help of Representative Howard A. Hanson, a young City of Seattle lawyer of Norwegian descent. During the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition in 1909, H. P. Rude, charter member of the Lodge, was City Councilman and very active in making arrangements for Norway Day. The day proved to have the highest single day's attendance of any other country during the exposition. Women were allowed to join the Sons of Norway as social members in 1912, but here in Seattle, women were active in a sister organization call Grand Lodge Daughters of Norway Pacific Coast which was formed on October 19, 1905, with the help of the Sons of Norway of the Pacific Coast. The first lodge was Valkyrien Lodge No. 1. The two groups had very close affiliations, meeting on the same day at the same time, even owning two buildings together until the selling of Norway Center.

Now we are in our third building where we are now the sole owner. We have been here since 1986. Many of the volunteers who built our hall are now gone, but we carry on with raising money to upgrade and repair our home for the future so we don't have to move again. We appreciate the many volunteers and donors who continue to make Leif Erikson Lodge 2-001 and Leif Erikson Hall a great place!
